Loire Valley is producer of TURNING 15 ON THE ROAD TO FREEDOM, the true story of Lynda Blackmon, a Black 14 year-old who went to jail 9 times, endured a brutal beating along with John Lewis while crossing the Edmund Pettus Bridge, and walked 54 miles from Selma to Montgomery in 1965 to demand the right to vote for African Americans. HARLEM HERITAGE NOW will present Turning 15 on the Road to Freedom in Harlem venues such as City College of New York, the Schomberg Center for Re- search and Black Culture, and the Interfaith Center, extending its impact through virtual and live engagements.









